<b>Reasons supporting proposal:</b> As set forth in Unemployment Insurance Program Letter No. 3-17 (Dec. 8, 2016), the United States Department of Labor strongly recommends unemployment agencies implement an automated scheduling service to allow claimants to self-schedule the dates they will participate in reemployment services in order to increase the number of claimants who participate in reemployment services.
