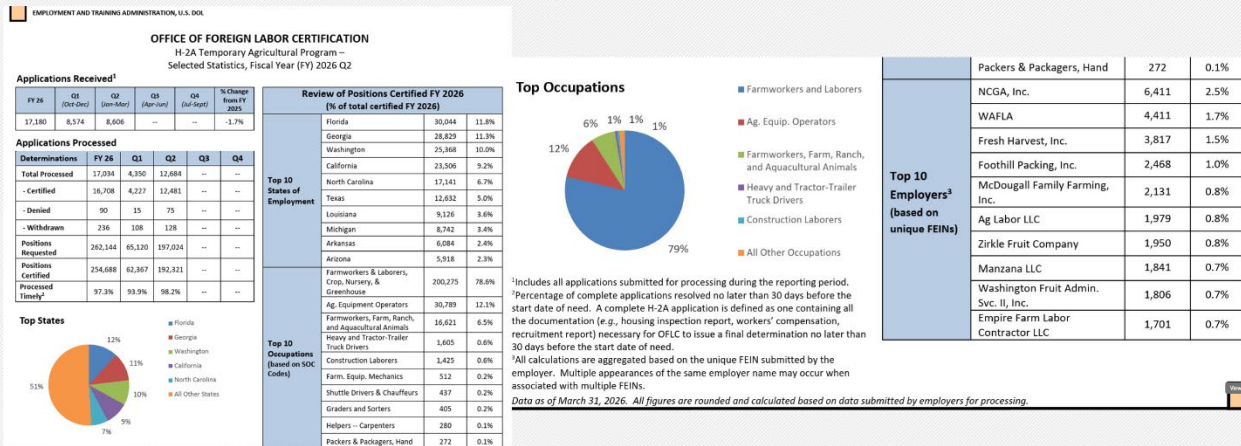

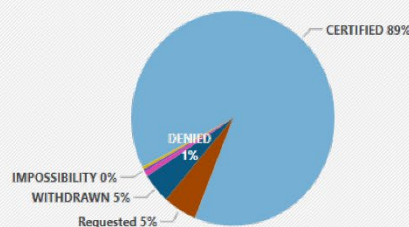

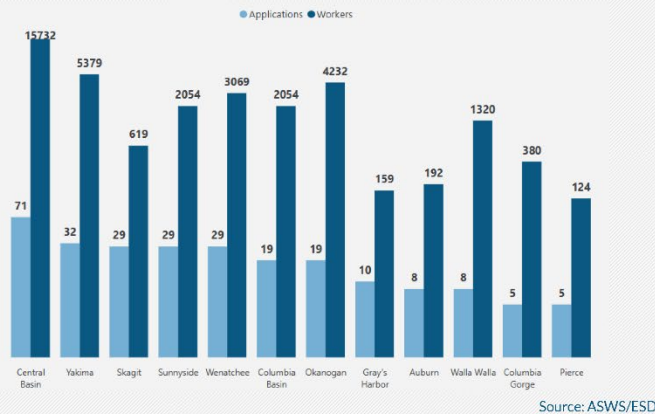

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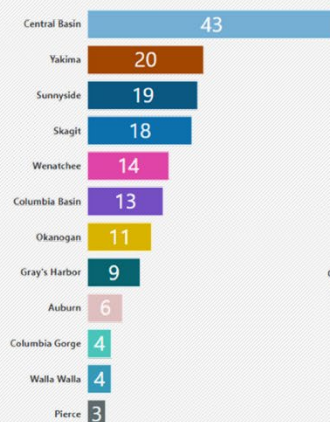
Number of active contracts & workers; by AHO Started by and ended after April 30, 2026



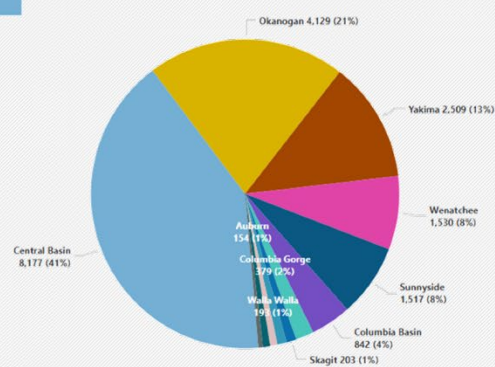

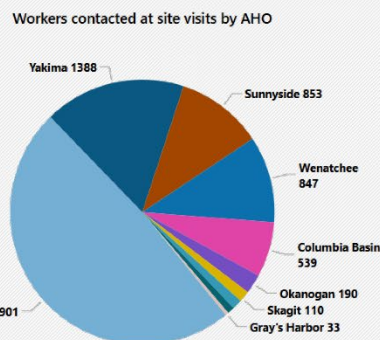

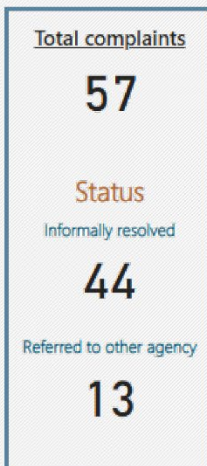

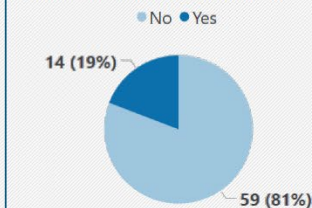

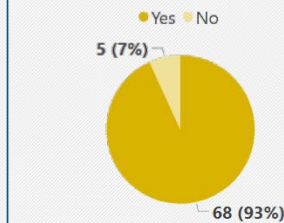

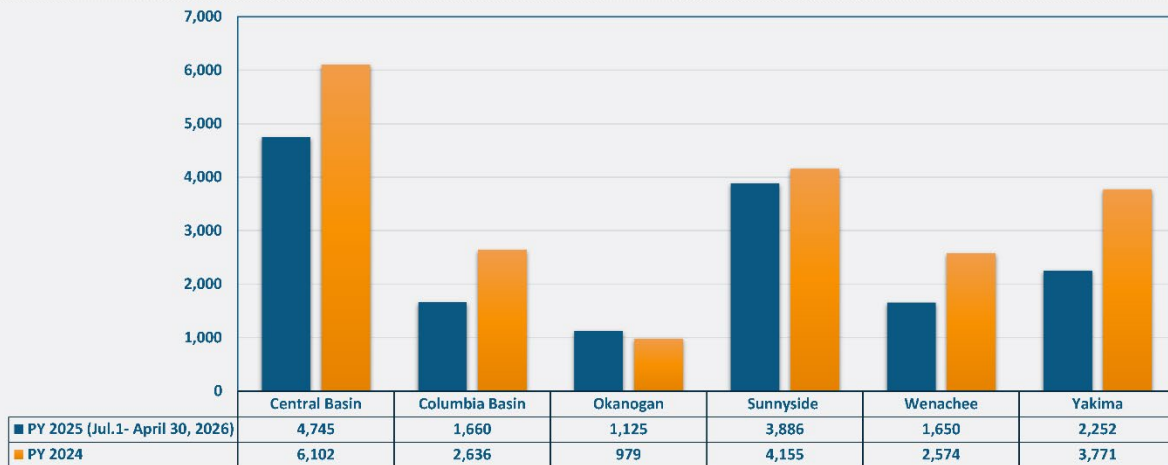

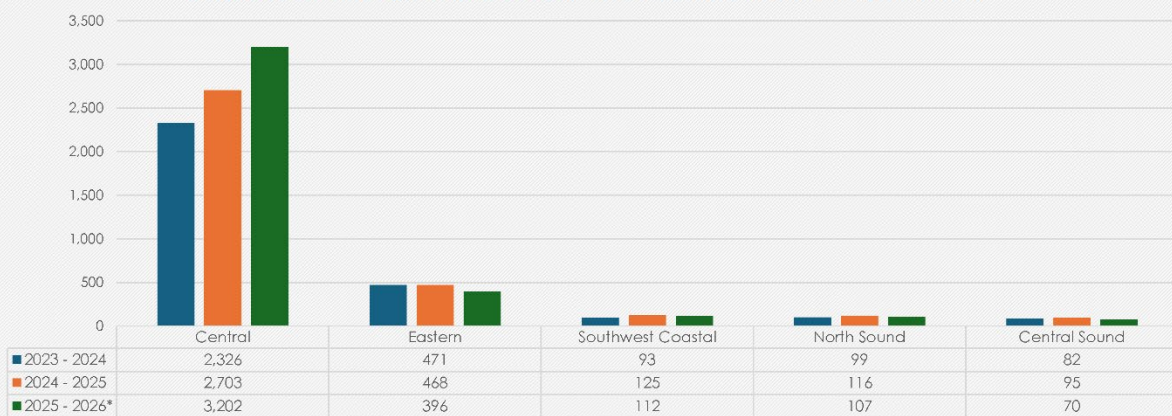
MSFWs Contacted by Full-time Outreach Offices

Disaster Unemployment Assistance Benefits (DUA)



DUA for workers impacted by December 2025 storms

Disaster Unemployment Assistance (DUA) is now available for eligible workers who lost employment due to storms and flooding in Washington Dec. 5-19, 2025. Benefits may be payable retroactively from the week beginning Sunday, Dec. 7, 2025, and available through the week ending Saturday, Oct. 10.

DUA benefits may provide financial help if you both:

- Lost or experienced interruptions in employment or self-employment because of the disaster.
- Did not qualify for regular unemployment benefits. You need to have applied for unemployment benefits and not qualified before you can apply for DUA.

The deadline to apply for DUA benefits is June 10, 2026.
