8	HEARING OFFICER JOSHUA DYE: Pursuant to the
9	authority given under the Washington State law, this
10	hearing is hereby convened. For the record, this hearing
11	is beginning at 9:01 a.m. on June 11, 2020. Due to the
12	Governor's "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" order, this hearing is
13	being held via teleconference.
14	This hearing is convened to consider testimony on
15	unemployment benefits while on leave of absence. Notice of
16	this hearing was submitted to the Washington State Register
17	on May 4, 2020, as WSR 20-10-072, and sent to interested
18	parties via the Department's electronic delivery system.
19	My name is Josh Dye and I am the Legislative and
20	Rules Coordinator for the Washington State Unemployment
21	Security Department's Legal Services.
22	I represent the Commissioner as hearing officer
23	presiding at this rule-making hearing.
24	We have one other staff. I'll let them introduce
25	themselves at the moment.

1	MR. SCOTT MICHAEL: Good morning. This is Scott
2	Michael, Legal Services Coordination Manager.
3	HEARING OFFICER JOSHUA DYE: Off the record.
4	Dixie, can you mute your line?
5	(Off the record)
б	HEARING OFFICER JOSHUA DYE: And continuing, I
7	will call on participants to testify based on your phone
8	number. When you're called to testify, please state your
9	name, organization, phone number, and address or e-mail
10	address for the record.
11	Please be advised that this hearing is being
12	transcribed. The transcript will become part of the
13	official rule-making file. This hearing is convened to
14	receive written submissions and oral testimony presented on
15	the proposal.
16	A Concise Explanatory Statement of the agency's
17	reasons for adoption of the rules, including a summary and
18	response to all comments received for each rule, will be
19	sent to all requesting and commenting parties and placed in
20	the permanent rule-making files. The Concise Explanatory
21	Statement for the rule will also be published on the
22	agency's rule-making webpage, which is
23	www.esd.wa.gov/newsroom/rulemaking.
24	For a brief explanation of the proposed rule:
25	Washington Administrative Code 192-170-080(1)(a) was

1	determined to be invalid by the Commissioner of the
2	Employment Security Department. In that decision the
3	Commissioner determined the rule was in direct conflict
4	with RCW 50.04.310. Consequently, the Department is
5	repealing WAC 192-170-080(1)(a). The remainder of
6	Washington Administrative Code 192-170-080 will remain in
7	effect.
8	We will now hear testimony from those logged in in
9	attendance concerning the proposal.
10	Mr. Battles, would you like to begin?
11	MR. BOB BATTLES: Sure. Bob Battles,
12	Association of Washington Business. We are the State
13	chamber and the state technology and manufacturing
14	association. Our members employ about 750,000 of the
15	State's employees, and I'm testifying with some concerns
16	about this change. A couple of things are concerning.
17	First of all, I'm concerned about the notice process
18	and the timing. The only information that was received
19	of course, we had the notice that said the time of the
20	hearing. Any links took an extreme amount of time to find,
21	multiple conversations with people to try to even find the
22	call-in information, which was only located in the 102 on
23	one line.
24	We had concerns with the timing that written comments
25	options were prior being submitted as of June 10, which

1 was not before -- after the hearing and also have concerns 2 with the fact that the adoption of date or adoption date of 3 the rule is to be the 15th of June.

We believe this process, especially during the COVID-19 situation, should be spread out and given more time. This comes from also the fact that this is not an emergency rule because it's based on -- the reason why this rule is being adopted is based on a decision that was made in 2011, which does not warrant then the expedited and/or emergency type of approach that this has been done.

11 With that in mind, we also believe that this rule 12 change goes beyond what the case was and that the case did not invalidate as much as it said that when looking at a 13 14 particular situation, you evaluate what the purpose behind 15 the layoff is. And in this case you would have either 16 asked the question of whether there should have been an 17 employee -- was it an employee voluntary quit, or was this 18 not a voluntary guit? That's what -- with the wholesale 19 removal of this rule, you open up what I believe to be the 20 possibility of conformity issues with the federal 21 government and that you are excusing certain individuals 2.2 from the requirement to search for work because of their, a 23 lot of times, their status being "leave of absence" and yet 24 then turning around and providing them with UI's, which 25 would put you in conformity issues.

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Therefore, we would oppose this rule change and ask
that more time be done before this gets moved on to the
next stage and look forward to responses to these concerns.
