ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

In collaboration with a local workforce development partner, the regional TAA Case Manager attended a Rapid Response event for REC Silicone, a former TAA-certified employer with previous petitions and a history of recalling laid-off workers. This engagement successfully generated interest among eligible TAA workers, resulting in new enrollments. The Case Manager provided valuable insights into TAA benefits, serving as a direct and accessible point of contact, which significantly boosted customer engagement. Additionally, the Case Manager identified On-the-Job Training (OJT) as a crucial pathway for laid-off workers, given the limited number of local employers requiring the specialized skill set of REC workers and the constrained training options available. In response, the Case Manager actively assisted a worker in securing an OJT opportunity with a local employer and is collaborating with the local workforce development board to create additional OJT placements, ensuring more TAA-eligible workers can access training and employment support.

In collaboration with a local workforce development partner, the regional TAA Case Manager attended a Rapid Response event for REC Silicone, a former TAA-certified employer with previous petitions and a history of recalling laid-off workers. This engagement successfully generated interest among eligible TAA workers, resulting in new enrollments. The Case Manager provided valuable insights into TAA benefits, serving as a direct and accessible point of contact, which significantly boosted customer engagement. Additionally, the Case Manager identified On-the-Job Training (OJT) as a crucial pathway for laid-off workers, given the limited number of local employers requiring the specialized skill set of REC workers and the constrained training options available. In response, the Case Manager actively assisted a worker in securing an OJT opportunity with a local employer and is collaborating with the local workforce development board to create additional OJT placements, ensuring more TAA-eligible workers can access training and employment support.
