Once implemented, the system is expected to improve participant outcomes by streamlining service delivery and enabling comprehensive, one-stop customer service for TAA dislocated workers. The integration of modern computer hardware is anticipated to increase organizational speed, responsiveness, and overall efficiency in delivering TAA and Trade Readjustment Allowance (TRA) services. These upgrades are also expected to strengthen data security and ensure compatibility with future system enhancements, supporting long-term sustainability and adaptability.
