Good morning. My name is 9 MS. BENHAM: Janette Benham, and I'm the rules coordinator for 10 11 the Leave and Care Division of the Washington State 12 Employment Security Department. Thank you for 13 joining us today for this rulemaking hearing, and 14 I'd like to discuss a few housekeeping items before 15 we begin the hearing. 16 Just a reminder that this meeting concerns 17 proposed regulations regarding the WA Cares 18 program. This meeting will not feature discussion 19 of any specific application, and attendance is 20 completely optional. BENHAM: We'll go ahead and start the 14 hearing. Pursuant to the authority given under 15 Washington State Law RCW 50B.04.020, RCW 16 50B.04.050, RCW 50B.04.120, RCW 50B.04.180, Chapter 17 42.30 RCW of the Open Public Meetings Act, and 18 Chapter 34.05 of the Administrative Procedure Act, 19 this hearing is hereby convened. 20 For the record, this hearing is beginning at 21 9:08 a.m. on January 22nd, 2005 [sic] online and by 2.2 conference call. 23 This hearing is convened to consider testimony 24 concerning rulemaking for the Long-Term Services 25 and Supports Trust Program, also known as WA Cares

Page 6 Fund. At a high level, this rulemaking amends 1 existing rules and creates new rules to implement a 2 portion of Substitute House Bill 2467 which passed 3 4 during the 2024 legislative session, adds new definitions, addresses appeal procedures, and adds 5 new rules related to qualified individuals. 6 7 Notice of this hearing was filed on December 18th, 2024, and published in Washington 8 State Register as WSR number 25-01-166, was sent to 9 10 interested parties, and was posted on the 11 department's web page. 12 My name is Janette Benham, and I'm the rules 13 coordinator for the Leave and Care Division of the 14 Washington State Employment Security Department. 15 I represent Commissioner Cami Feek as the 16 hearing officer presiding at this public rulemaking 17 hearing. 18 There are other members of the Leave and Care 19 Policy team attending this hearing. Please 20 introduce yourselves by name and title. 21 MR. CAIN: Good morning, I'm Brett Cain. I'm 22 a policy analyst for the Employment Security 23 Department. 24 Good morning, my name is Jason MR. BARRETT: 25 Barrett. I'm the lead policy analyst for the Leave

and Care division.

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MS. BENHAM: Thank you, Jason and Brett. 2 Please be advised that this hearing is 3 4 recorded by the Microsoft Teams platform. The recording will become a part of the official 5 rulemaking file. To facilitate the recording, 6 7 please state and then spell your name before your testimony. If you are here in a representative 8 9 capacity, please include who you are providing testimony on behalf of. 10

11 Please also note that this hearing is convened 12 to consider comments on the proposed rules. 13 Because of the formal nature of this hearing, we 14 are unlikely to answer any questions you may ask. 15 If you do pose a question, I will ask you to 16 rephrase your question as a comment. 20 Written comments on the proposed rules will be 21 accepted through today by e-mail at 22 rules@esd.wa.gov, and a concise explanatory 23 statement of the agency's reasons for adoption of 24 the rules including a summary and response to all 25 comments received after the publication of the

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proposed rules will be placed in the permanent 1 rulemaking file and posted online. This document 2 will be sent to all interested parties who have 3 signed up to receive WA Cares Fund rules e-mails. 4 We will begin with Brett Cain who will provide 5 a brief explanation of the proposal. 6 7 MR. CAIN: Thanks, Janette. Substitute House Bill 2467 passed during the 2024 legislative 8 session. The bill allowed individuals who move out 9 of the state to elect to continue their WA Cares 10 11 coverage. The proposed rules implement a portion 12 of the bill that was codified in RCW 50B.04.180 by 13 defining "out-of-state participant." The proposed 14 rules also add program definitions of "qualified 15 individual" and "year," outline qualified 16 individual requirements and determinations, and 17 further align the WA Cares Fund and Paid Family and

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19I encourage you all to read the text of the20rules along with the supporting documents for a21more robust understanding.

Medical Leave appeals processes.

25 MS. BENHAM: Thank you, Brett.

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Page 9 We will now hear testimony from those in 1 attendance. I'll go through each rule 2 individually, outline the proposed amendments to 3 4 each rule, and accept comment on each rule. All attendees are currently muted, and if you 5 wish to speak, you can unmute yourselves through 6 7 your Teams window or by pressing star six if you're 8 joining by phone. If you are double muted when using your phone to call in, please remember to 9 10 press star six, and then unmute your phone using 11 your phone's mute/unmute button. 12 When you testify, please speak clearly, state 13 your name, spell your last name, and state who you 14 represent if you are here in a representative 15 capacity. 16 When you finish testifying, please mute 17 yourself through your Teams window or press star 18 six again on your phone. 19 We'll start with Chapter 192-900 WAC -20 definitions. There are three new rules added to 21 this chapter. The first rule is WAC 192-900-040 out-of-state 2.2 participant. This rule defines an out-of-state 23 24 participant as an individual who has elected 25 coverage under RCW 50B.04.180. It refers to people

Page 10 who move outside of Washington and elect to 1 continue WA Cares coverage. 2 Are there any questions or comments on this 3 4 rule? (No Response.) 5 MS. BENHAM: The next rule is WAC 192-900-045 6 7 qualified individual. This rule defines a 8 qualified individual as someone who has met the requirements under RCW 50B.04.050 and Chapter 9 192-940 WAC. Both of these references outline the 10 11 details of contribution requirements to qualify for 12 the benefit. 13 Are there any comments on this rule? 14 (No Response.) 15 MS. BENHAM: The next rule and the last of the 16 definitions chapter is WAC 192-900-050 year. This 17 rule defines a year as a calendar year, beginning 18 on January 1st and ending on December 31st. 19 Are there any comments on this rule? 20 (No Response.) The next rule is WAC 192-925-015 21 MS. BENHAM: 22 sections of general procedural rules for appeal 23 under Chapter 192-800 WAC apply. This amendment 24 adds a reference to a Paid Family and Medical Leave 25 rule to ensure the processes and procedures for the

Page 11 department to address appeals align between both 1 programs the Leave and Care division manages. 2 Alignment is required under RCW 50B.04.120. 3 The 4 referenced section, WAC 192-800-155, specifically outlines what proceedings are open to the public 5 and what information is publicly disclosable. 6 7 Are there any comments on this rule? 8 (No Response.) MS. BENHAM: The next two rules are in a new 9 chapter of administrative code, Chapter 192-940 WAC 10 11 qualified individuals. There are two new rules in 12 this chapter. 13 The first is WAC 192-940-005 earning years to 14 become a qualified individual. This rule outlines 15 what wages and hours will be used in the determination of years earned toward qualified 16 17 individual status, how the hours will be determined in a year, and specifies that wages and hours 18 19 reported when an individual had an approved 20 exemption don't count toward qualifying for the benefit. 21 2.2 Are there any comments on this rule? 23 (No Response.) 24 MS. BENHAM: The final rule for today's 25 hearing is WAC 192-940-010 how will the department

Page 12 determine if someone is a qualified individual? 1 This rule outlines the three different options 2 available for someone to become a qualified 3 individual, outlines the circumstances in which 4 someone could continue to earn years toward 5 6 becoming a qualified individual, clarifies that people may not exceed the maximum lifetime benefit 7 amount, and that people who have approved 8 exemptions cannot become qualified individuals. 9 10 Are there any comments on this rule? Hello, are you asking for the comment of 11 12 192-949 at this point or . . . MS. BENHAM: This final rule that is -- that 13 14 we're asking for comment is 192-940-010. 15 MR. FORMAN: Yes, I do have a comment on that 16 actually. 17 MS. BENHAM: Okay. Can you please state your 18 name and spell it? And if you're here in a 19 representative capacity, state who you are 20 representing, and then we will be happy to accept 21 your comment. 22 Sure can. This is Stephen MR. FORMAN: 23 Forman, S-T-E-P-H-E-N, F-O-R-M-A-N, not here on 24 behalf of any particular organization; just my 25 company, Long Term Care Associates, Inc.

I'm just reading this rule here for the second 1 time, and my comment would be -- since I know I 2 3 can't ask this in the form of a question, my 4 comment would be that something the department will want to take a look at -- and I'm looking at 5 section A in particular -- if someone does have a 6 7 break of five years and they have not earned ten years, I don't think it's clear whether or not they 8 9 will have to start the entire ten-year period over again or whether they just have to accrue the 10 11 remaining years that they might have not hit. Ι 12 hope that makes sense.

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13 If you've done nine years and then you have a 14 break of five years and you go back to work, the 15 question would be do you only have to accrue one 16 more year to hit your ten-year total, or do you 17 have to then -- has the break occurred and then are 18 you back at scratch and then you have to earn a 19 whole ten years of consecutive work without that 20 break?

I don't think that's entirely clear. Maybe
it's just me, maybe it's clear to everyone else,
but that would be my comment pretty much.
MS. BENHAM: Thank you, Stephen. We

appreciate your comment and we'll consider that.

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Page 14 Are there any other comments on this rule? 1 (No Response.) 2 MS. BENHAM: Okay. I'd like to take a moment 3 4 and ask if there is any additional testimony on any of the rules proposed today. 5 6 Is there any additional testimony? If there 7 is, please feel free to provide that comment now 8 and indicate which rule you're providing comment 9 on. 10 (No Response.) 11 MS. BENHAM: Is there any further testimony 12 from anyone on the phone before I conclude this 13 hearing? 14 (No Response.) 15 MS. BENHAM: Okay. In conclusion, this 16 hearing was convened to consider testimony on WA 17 Cares Fund rulemaking. 18 All oral testimony presented at this hearing 19 and any written submissions will become part of the 20 official record.
