Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: The Employment Security									
Department (department) is proposing new rules and amendments regarding the Long-Term Services and Supports Trust									
Program (WA Cares Fund) to implement portions of Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill (ESSB) 5291 (Chapter 380, Laws of									
2025). The proposed rules implement portions of ESSB 5291 and include requirements regarding qualifying for benefits, a									
new voluntary exemption for off-duty civilian employment for active-duty service members, automatic exemptions for non-									
immigrant work visa holders, voluntary rescission of private long-term care insurance exemptions, qualified individual									
determinations for a pilot project, and collective bargaining agreement participation requirements. Additional proposed rules									
include a new chapter regarding due process when additional information is requested by the department.									
Reasons supporting proposal: The proposed rules implement requirements of ESSB 5291 and outline due process									
requirements when the department has requested additional information from interested parties in order to make
