In partnership with the Rapid Response Team and a neighboring state, a multi-state petition was submitted along with others triggered by WARN layoff notifications. All were filed with the U.S. DOL pending for program reauthorization, reinforcing the program's value to impacted dislocated workers. These efforts resulted in three pending petitions representing 3,314 Washington workers. Continued collaboration led to identification and referral of eligible individuals, with three new participants enrolled during this period.
