- 1 MS. JANETTE BENHAM: Okay. Good morning,
- 2 everyone. My name is Janette Benham and I am the rules
- 3 coordinator for the Leave and Care Division of the
- 4 Washington State Employment Security Department. Thank you
- 5 for joining us today for this rulemaking hearing, and I'd
- 6 like to discuss a few housekeeping items before we begin.
- 7 Just a reminder that this meeting concerns proposed
- 8 regulations regarding the WA Cares program. This meeting
- 9 will not feature discussion of any specific application, and
- 10 attendance is completely optional.
- 11 If you have questions regarding your own
- 12 application for exemption or weekly claim for paid family
- 13 and medical leave or if you have other general questions,
- 14 please call our customer care team at (833) 717-2273. We
- 15 won't be able to answer any questions during this meeting.
- Today's hearing is regarding the proposal that
- 17 adds and revises sections of Washington Administrative Code
- 18 regarding the implementation of portions of Engrossed
- 19 Substitute Senate Bill 5291, which passed during the 2025
- 20 legislative session. The proposal also adds new rules
- 21 regarding determinations.
- 22 If you would like to provide written comments
- 23 related to these rules, you may do so by email at rules,

- 25 comments through the close of business today.

- 4 under Long-Term Services and Supports Rulemaking. Clicking
- 5 on each of the topics will bring up the proposed rules for
- 6 each individual chapter, and as we progress through the
- 7 hearing, you may have to use your browser's back button to
- 8 view the next chapter of the rules we'll be discussing.
- 9 Before we begin, are there any questions about the
- 10 purpose of today's meeting or where to find the proposed
- 11 rules? You can unmute yourself using your Teams window or

- 23 Pursuant to the authority given under Washington State Law
- 24 RCW 50B.04.020, RCW 50B.04.053, RCW 50B.04.055, RCW
- 50B.04.085, Chapter 42.30 RCW of the Open Public Meetings

- 1 Act, and Chapter 34.05 of the Administrative Procedure Act,
- 2 this hearing is hereby convened. For the record, this
- 3 hearing is beginning at 9:05 a.m. on October 21st, 2025
- 4 online and by conference call. This hearing is convened to
- 5 consider testimony concerning rulemaking for the Long-Term
- 6 Services and Supports Trust program, also known as WA Cares
- 7 Fund.
- 8 At a high level, this rulemaking implements
- 9 portions of Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill ESSB 5291,
- 10 which passed during the 2025 legislative session, and
- 11 includes proposed rules that address a pilot project,
- 12 qualifying for benefits, a new voluntary exemption for
- 13 off-duty civilian employment for active-duty service
- 14 members, automatic exemptions for non-immigrant work visa
- 15 holders, voluntary rescissions of private long-term care
- 16 insurance exemptions, and collective bargaining agreement
- 17 participation requirements.
- 18 In addition, new rules are included in the
- 19 proposal to address determinations made by the Department.
- 20 Notice of this hearing was filed on September 17th, 2025 and
- 21 published in the Washington State Register as WSR No.
- 22 25-19-009, was sent to interested parties and was posted on
- 23 the Department's webpage.
- 24 My name is Janette Benham and I'm the rules
- 25 coordinator for the Leave and Care Division of the

- 1 Washington State Employment Security Department. I
- 2 represent Commissioner Cami Feek as the hearing officer
- 3 presiding at this public rulemaking hearing. There are
- 4 other members of the Leave and Care Policy Team attending
- 5 this hearing. Please introduce yourselves by name and
- 6 title.
- 7 MR. BRETT CAIN: Good morning. I'm Brett Cain.
- 8 I'm a policy analyst here at ESD, and I work on the rules
- 9 team for the leave and care programs including LTSS and WA
- 10 Cares.
- 11 MR. JASON BARRETT: Good morning everyone. My
- 12 name is Jason Barrett. I'm the lead policy analyst for the
- 13 Leave and Care Division policy team. Thanks for joining us
- 14 today.
- 15 MS. JANETTE BENHAM: Thank you, Brett and Jason.
- 16 Please be advised that this hearing is being
- 17 transcribed by a court reporter and is also being recorded
- 18 by the Microsoft Teams platform. The transcript and
- 19 recording will become a part of the official rulemaking
- 20 file. To facilitate the transcription, please state and
- 21 then spell your name before your testimony. If you are here
- 22 in a representative capacity, please include who you are
- 23 providing testimony on behalf of. Please also note that
- 24 this hearing is convened to consider comments on the
- 25 proposed rules.

- 1 Because of the formal nature of this hearing, we
- 2 are unlikely to answer any questions you may ask. If you do
- 3 pose a question, I'll ask you to rephrase your question as a
- 4 comment. Questions can be emailed to us at

- 7 Written comments on the proposed rules will be
- 8 accepted through today by email at rules@esd.wa.gov. A
- 9 concise explanatory statement of the agency's reasons for
- 10 adoption of the rules, including a summary and response to
- 11 all comments received after the publication of the proposed
- 12 rules will be placed in the permanent rulemaking file and
- 13 posted online. This document will be sent to all interested
- 14 parties who have signed up to receive WA Cares fund rules
- 15 emails.
- 16 I encourage you all to read the text of the rules
- 17 along with the supporting documents for a more robust
- 18 understanding. Thank you for your interest and
- 19 participation in our rulemaking efforts, and we look forward
- 20 to hearing your comments today. We will now move on and
- 21 hear testimony from those in attendance. I'll go through
- 22 each rule individually, outline the proposed new rule or
- 23 amendments to an existing rule, and then accept comment on
- 24 each rule. All attendees are currently muted, and if you
- 25 wish to speak, you can unmute yourself through your Teams

- 1 window or by pressing star six if you're joining by phone.
- When you testify, please speak clearly, state your
- 3 name, spell your last name, and state who you represent if
- 4 you are here in a representative capacity. When you finish
- 5 testifying, please mute yourself through your Teams window
- 6 or press star six again on your phone.
- We'll start with exemptions in Chapter 192-905
- 8 WAC. There are three amended sections and two new sections
- 9 proposed. The first rule is WAC 192-905-005, eligibility
- 10 requirements for an employee to receive a permanent
- 11 exemption from the Long-Term Services and Supports Trust
- 12 program. ESSB 5291 made changes that add an option for
- 13 employees to rescind the previously approved long-term care
- 14 insurance exemption and participate in the program.
- 15 Individuals may do so prior to July 1st, 2028.
- 16 The proposed rule amendment references the section
- 17 of WAC, Washington Administrative Code, that describes how
- 18 to rescind this type of exemption. Other changes to this
- 19 section are administrative.
- 20 Are there any comments on this rule?
- 21 (No response)
- 22 Hearing none, we'll move to the next rule. The
- 23 next rule is WAC 192-905-006, Eligibility requirements for
- 24 an employee to receive a conditional exemption from the
- 25 Long-Term Services and Supports Trust program. ESSB 5291

- 1 made changes that automatically exempt employees who hold
- 2 non-immigrant visas for temporary workers unless they choose
- 3 to participate. Reference to these workers was removed from
- 4 the rule because of this automatic exemption. ESSB 5291
- 5 also added a new voluntary conditional exemption for
- 6 active-duty service members in the U.S. armed forces who are
- 7 concurrently engaged in off-duty civilian employment.
- 8 Reference to this exemption type was added to the rule.
- 9 Are there any comments on this rule?
- 10 (No response)
- 11 The next rule is a new section, WAC 192-905-008,
- 12 Automatic exemption for an employee who holds a
- 13 non-immigrant visa for temporary workers. The rule outlines
- 14 the changes made by ESSB 5291 where non-immigrant temporary
- 15 work visa holders as recognized by federal law are
- 16 automatically exempt from the program unless they choose to
- 17 participate.
- 18 The rule outlines requirements for the employee to
- 19 notify their employers if they would like to participate in
- 20 the program. It also outlines the requirement that once the
- 21 employee is a permanent resident or citizen, premiums must
- 22 begin being assessed in the quarter immediately following
- 23 permanent status.
- 24 Are there any comments on this rule?
- 25 (No response)

- The next rule is a new section, WAC 192-905-009,
- 2 rescission for an employee who has received a voluntary
- 3 long-term care insurance exemption. ESSB 5291 made changes
- 4 that allow individuals to rescind their voluntary long-term
- 5 care insurance exemption through July 1st, 2028. This rule
- 6 outlines the dates this rescission is available and the
- 7 process an employee must take to rescind their permanent
- 8 long-term care insurance exemption. The rule also requires
- 9 the employer at the time of rescission to maintain a copy of
- 10 the rescission letter the employee provides.
- 11 Are there any comments on this rule?
- 12 (No response)
- 13 The last rule in the exemptions chapter is WAC
- 14 192-905-020, Is an exempt employee entitled to a refund of
- 15 premiums? The amendments add language that requires a
- 16 refund of premiums an employer may have collected from an
- 17 employee who holds a non-immigrant visa for temporary
- 18 workers.
- 19 Are there any comments on this rule?
- 20 (No response)
- 21 The next rule is in the Assessing and Collecting
- 22 Premiums chapter, WAC 192-910-015, What are the employer's
- 23 responsibilities for premium deductions? The amendments to
- 24 this rule add the requirement for employers to not deduct
- 25 premiums for an employee who holds a non-immigrant visa for

- 1 temporary workers unless the employee participates in the
- 2 program under WAC 192-905-008, and adds references to the
- 3 requirement for employers to deduct premiums for an employee
- 4 who no longer qualifies for a conditional exemption, becomes
- 5 a permanent resident or citizen, or rescinds their long-term
- 6 care insurance exemption.
- 7 Are there any comments on this rule?
- 8 (No response)
- 9 The next rule is WAC 192-920-005, Parties to
- 10 collective bargaining agreements. ESSB 5291 removed the
- 11 non-participation provision for parties to collective
- 12 bargaining agreements. The amendment to this rule sunsets
- 13 the collective bargaining non-participation provisions after
- 14 December 31st, 2025. This aligns with the Paid Family and
- 15 Medical Leave sunsetting that was effective after December
- 16 31st, 2023.
- 17 Are there any comments on this rule?
- 18 (No response)
- 19 The next two rules are in the Qualified
- 20 Individuals chapter of WAC. One rule is amended and one is
- 21 a new rule. The first rule in this chapter is WAC
- 22 192-940-010, How will the Department determine if someone is
- 23 a qualified individual? ESSB 5291 removed the break of five
- 24 or more consecutive years of work and contributions from the
- 25 10-year qualifying pathway so that any combination of a

- 1 qualifying 10 years may be counted. The amendments remove
- 2 the break of five or more consecutive years language and
- 3 clarify that benefit percentages and maximums are related to
- 4 the maximum program benefit amount.
- 5 Are there any comments on this rule?
- (No response)
- 7 The next rule is a new section, WAC 192-940-011,
- 8 How is a qualified individual determination made for the
- 9 pilot project? ESSB 5291 created a pilot project to be
- 10 conducted between January 1st and June 30th, 2026 to assess
- 11 administrative processes and system capabilities for the
- 12 program. The rule outlines how qualified individual
- 13 determinations will be made for the pilot project that
- 14 selective individuals may participate in.
- 15 Are there any comments on this rule?
- 16 (No response)
- 17 The last three rules for today's hearing are in a
- 18 new chapter, 192-950 WAC regarding determinations. These
- 19 rules are related to due process when additional information
- 20 is requested by the Department. The new rules in this
- 21 chapter are modeled after Paid Family and Medical Leave
- 22 rules in Chapter 192-30 WAC. The first new rule in this
- 23 chapter is WAC 192-950-005, What happens if there is a
- 24 question regarding an individual's application? The rule
- 25 outlines what actions the Department will take if additional

- 1 information is needed regarding applications for exemptions,
- 2 qualified individuals and out-of-state coverage.
- 3 Are there any comments on this rule?
- 4 (No response)
- 5 The second new rule in this chapter is WAC
- 6 192-950-010, What happens if an interested party does not
- 7 respond to the Department's request for information? The
- 8 rule outlines the actions the Department will take to make a
- 9 determination when there is no response regarding a request
- 10 for information.
- 11 Are there any comments on this rule?
- 12 (No response)
- 13 The last new rule in this chapter and the last
- 14 rule we'll talk about today is WAC 192-950-015, How will
- 15 determinations be made? The rule describes the process the
- 16 Department will use to make determinations, consider
- 17 information received and give interested parties an
- 18 opportunity to respond.
- 19 Are there any comments on this rule?
- 20 (No response)
- 21 I would like to take a moment and ask if there is
- 22 any testimony on any of the proposed rules included in
- 23 today's hearing. If there is any testimony, please feel
- 24 free to provide comment now and indicate which rule you're
- 25 providing comment on.
